MAN HIGH SCHOOL PRINTING DEPARTMENT

The Man Printing Department is under the able leadership of Mr. T. J. Arant. The department deserves much credit, as well as the thanks of the "Hillbilly Staff", for undertaking and putting acrosss a big job with so late a start.

The Man High Printing Department dates back to the fall of 1927. At that time, the faculty felt the need for such a deptartment very keenly Believing that he was attempting to perform a real service for the school and community, Mr. Withers made a proposition to the Board of Education to the effect that the school would pay half the cost of a printing press if the Board of Education would pay the other half. The Board promptly accepted the proposal and the Man High Printing Department very soon became a reality. The total cost of the equipment was appreximately \$1500.

The department has exceeded expectations. All letter heads, envelopes, posters, papers, school blanks, etc. are printed here. Many jobs are printed for patrons and frinds of the school at a low cost. This is the second year book published by this department. No other department of the school actually pays its own way so completely as the Printing Department of the Man High School.


